Trinity Sunday

Today's lessons from the Lectionary in church are Genesis 1:1-2:49, Psalm 8, 2 Corinthians 1311-13, and the Matthew 28:16-20.

Now that Sunday School is over for the summer there will be a Godly Play storytime for the younger children ages 3 to 7 or grades Pre-k - 2nd. Older children ages 8 and above will attend church with their parents. This is an excellent time for the older children to attend church and learn the format of the whole service. This week's Godly Play story is Paul's Discovery. This story focuses on living in the power of the Holy Spirit. Paul's life is presented in seven "snap shots" depicting the most important events and places of his journey, meant to be read out loud as we still do today in church. Melinda Rucinski is our storyteller and Carol Goslee is our Doorkeeper. Weather permitting the children will go outside following the story for outdoor activities.

Regular Wednesday evening Youth Group is on hiatus for the summer. The youth plan to meet occasionally during the summer for field trips.

THE BLESSING OF A B MINUS Honor Your Teen's Natural Abilities and Limitations

Continuing from last week Dr. Wendy Mogul, PhD. writes; ""Recognizing your teen's temperament allows you to step back from our culture's narrow definition of success and see your child in her splendid uniqueness.

Letting your child relax into her true nature does not mean that your abandon your parental duties to protect, guide, and inspire. For example, you don't say, "Clearly an explorer/inventor/true poet/refined soul like you must feel trapped by the dull duties of everyday life, so blow off all your homework, skip your chores, catch the next bus out of town, and go seek creative fulfillment!" Nor do you say, "Because of your learning differences and sensitivity and very, very special needs, you are excused from the work the rest of us have to do." Instead, you balance your child's obligations with opportunities that match his ever-changing, emerging self. Allow your organized, slightly bossy child to quit chess club if he hates it, and let him take up the job of stage manager for the next choir production if that's where his heart lies. Don't confine your physically adventurous child indoors all weekend to study; let him ride a mountain bike or play paintball in the woods.

Honoring your child's temperament is an expression of *bitachon*. Our children belong to God and are made in God's image. Faith means believing that God doesn't make flawed merchandise. It means trusting that your child's innate attributes are proper and appropriate for them, that they are sufficient even for an uncertain future.""

In Church School this week:

Each week, the children's and youth Sunday School classes focus on a passage from Scripture. These follow the same Revised Common Lectionary that provides readings for Sunday services. We use a curriculum, Seasons of the Spirit, to tailor a lesson for each class that is interactive, fun and age appropriate. This section features the Scripture learned that week in Sunday School, along with some questions to ask about during the week.

Focus Scripture: Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

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☆What's it all about?

After his resurrection, Jesus has told Mary
Magdalene and "the other Mary" (v. 1) to "tell my
brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me" (v.
10). Now Jesus appears to "the eleven" (v. 16, less
Judas) on "the mountain" where he was
transfigured. Some worship (v. 17) him, but others
doubt. He has received "all authority" (v. 18) from
the Father, so he now sends out his followers to "all
nations" (v. 19, not just Israel) to:

baptise in the possession and protection ("name") of the Trinity, and to carry on his teaching ministry.
